The Forthcoming IASI World Congress: IASI Representatives on a Site Visit to Beijing

12th IASI World Congress and IASI Annual Meeting Beijing, May 16 - 22, 2005 The Value of Sport Information: Towards Beijing 2008

IASI President Alain Poncet and IASI Congress Program Chair, Cindy Slater traveled to Beijing on November 15, 2004 to meet with the local hosts for the forthcoming IASI Congress that will be held on May 19-21, 2005 (with IASI Annual meeting May 16-18).

Prior to their flight to Beijing, Alain and Cindy stopped off in Calgary for a brief congress planning meeting, hosted by Gretchen Ghent at her office in the University of Calgary Law Library.

Reviewed during this meeting was the planning schedule from December 2004 to May 2005, the Congress website information, the travel information and other details.

The topics of the meetings ranged from the specifics of the Congress opening and closing ceremonies, the social program, publication of the congress proceedings, essential travel and visa information for participants, transportation from airport and hotels, staff assignments by the hosts for transportation, facilities, technology/AV, food services, and translation. Further information was sought on the location and nature of the food services, including the banquet and welcome reception. The technical support of the Congress operations was reviewed and the promised internet workstations that will be available for use by Congress participants. Website updating was also an important topic for many of the preceding details will be outlined and reported there as soon as possible.

The number and geographic representation of paper and poster submissions received so far are of some concern for there should be a greater number of submissions from a wider range of countries. To this end, emails have been sent to key individuals seeking further input to assure that there is a good geographical/linguistic representation of Congress papers and posters. A tour of the University of Calgary Olympic speed skating oval and later a trip to Canada Olympic Park (bobsled, luge, Olympic Museum) rounded out David's stay in Calgary.

In recent email to IASI-L the CIES Librarian, Marie-Claude Borel, reported that the CIES Library catalogue is now available online with the records also part of the RERO network of Swiss library holdings (the IOC Library also reports records to RERO). The inhouse database has over 7500 records mainly in the fields of sports law, sociology, economics and history in English, French and German. Also available in the Library section of the CIES website is a monthly Acquisitions List and a list of the periodicals received in the four disciplines mentioned above.

Staffing Changes at NSIC and in New Zealand

Joanne James commenced work at NSIC in 1989 and since 1997 was responsible for Australia's indexing contribution to the Sport Database and NSIC Full Text Archive. Simon Chamberlain has left the Library at Sport and Recreation New Zealand. A permanent replacement is yet to be appointed.

AUSPIN Workshop

The Australasian Sport Information Network (AUSPIN) Annual Workshop was held at the Queensland Academy of Sport on 18-19 November 2004. There were representatives from all Australia states except Western Australia, Fiji and Papua New Guinea. Main items discussed during the workshop were:

- National Elite Sports Council has given approval for AUSPIN to investigate the viability of an Australian Sport Electronic Information Consortia. During the next 6 months the consortia will look at issues such as:
 - Determination of consortia clients –type, number, method of access
 - Identification of suitable resources databases, journals, images, video
 - Costing and prioritisation of resources
 - Negotiations with publishers/agents regarding the consortia
 - Consortia management objectives, structure, policies, funding
 - Network access to the consortia
- Development of research centres of excellence at Institutes/Academies of Sport in Australia and their impact on Information Centres.
- AUSPIN will investigate linking AUSPIN Union Serials List to Sport Discus on EbscoHost. Majority of AUSPIN members have moved to Sport Discus on EbscoHost and are transferring major online titles to Ebsco.
- Open access publishing at the University of Queensland http://eprint.uq.edu.au/.
 Resources in ePrints and other similar digital archives are also search through OAIster http://oaister.umdl.umich.edu/o/oaister/. AUSPIN should look at how these online archives can be used by sport.
- Screen rights and copyright impacting on sport information in Australia.

Information Centre Changes

Queensland Academy of Sport Information Centre has moved into the refurbished Queensland Sports and Athletic Centre (formerly ANZ Stadium). Victorian Institute of Sport Information Centre has moved to Olympic Park in Melbourne. For the first time both these organisations are located at sporting complexes.

NSW Sports Information Centre at the Sydney Academy of Sport and Recreation is closing down and the collection is likely to be incorporated in the Australian College of Physical Education Library located at Olympic Park. The Librarian will move to the Dept of Tourism, Sport and Recreation Head Office in Olympic Park and provide general information services.

Active After-schools Program

The Australian Government has established Active After-School Communities. This program is an after school hours sports program that aims to improve the health and well being of Australia's primary school aged children through structured physical activity. It will be delivered nationally to
