The SIRC Workshop: a Report

On Wednesday morning, May 18, Debra Gassewitz, President & CEO of SIRC, began the workshop with an update on the SportDiscus database with comments on the present day challenges to database producers.

At December 2004, SportDiscus has 690,733 records, 86% contributed by SIRC indexing staff. New records added in 2004 equaled about 30,000 with additional 10,000 records that were updated or amalgamated. International contributors that year contributed:

In her comments on the current database industry, Debra outlined the challenges facing database producers. These include the growth of library/university consortia where lower subscription prices are asked for on behalf of all members of the consortia. This can have a negative impact on income for the database producer. Additionally other factors include the demand for more fulltext articles, higher copyright fees, and the new Google Scholar where researchers can find more academic papers online.

In consideration of these and other factors, Debra announced that as of March 31, 2005, *SPORTDiscus* database was sold to the vendor EBSCO. SIRC will remain as the indexer and producer of records. EBSCO focuses on academic, medical, and public libraries and has a growing strength in providing fulltext to the major journals. The database will also be available via OVID, DIALOG and SilverPlatter.

This change will afford SIRC the opportunity to protect *SPORTDiscus* as a database and strengthened sport information access and delivery. EBSCO has also promised to protect *SPORTDiscus*, work with SIRC on indexing and product development, guarantee international content and discounts to contributors. For the past four years, where SIRC has copyright permission, many indexed materials have been committed to fulltext. SIRC has permission to digitize articles from 840 journals from 300 publishers. This will compliment the fulltext offered by EBSCO. SIRC has been working with the Canadian sport sciences community to expand access to the database and offer document delivery to an organization's membership

For the near future, SIRC plans to introduce new journal titles, create a sub-database of Canadian sport, support and enhance document delivery services, concentrate on educating users in effective database searching techniques, and promote the Sport Research Award that honors excellence in sports sciences research.

The second part of the Workshop was conducted by Diane O'Dwyer, SIRC's Sport Information Manager and featured the basics of searching *SPORTDiscus* on the EBSCO platform. With a seven page Quick Guide in hand, a review of important features of the database was conducted. These included the "explode" feature using descriptors, the basics of Boolean and the importance of using "limiters" to produce a more specific search.

Key Activities from the 12th IASI World Congress, Beijing, May 19-21, 2005

The Congress opened on May 19 with welcoming speeches from the President of Beijing Sport University, dignitaries from the China Sport Information Center, the People's Government of the Haidian District, and IASI President Alain Poncet. The opening keynote speaker, Kristine Toohey from Australia's Griffith University presented the audience with the topic: Sport Information: Where Are We Now? This set the stage for the following keynote speakers Yoo Mi Steffen (on behalf of Philippe Blanchard, IOC), Melissa Kimmerly, Olympic Games Knowledge Services and Gilad Weingarten (Wingate Institute) speaking on "Perspectives from the Olympic Commentary Position." The 2nd Plenary speaker, Amit Solomon provided insight on importance of digitization of resources, with the 3rd Plenary speaker, Nick Rowe, looking at the politics, practice and realities of sport participation measurement. The keynote speaker for the 4th Plenary Session was Pierre Joseph de Hillerin who spoke on using sport information to promote elite athlete development. The 5th and final keynote speaker, Wayne Wilson, challenged participants to think about a new model for the sports library in this technological age.

There were three concurrent sessions running during the three-day congress. Each of the lecture rooms was equipped with a computer terminal and LCD projection along with a knowledgeable technician to assist the speakers. Generous poster session times were set aside for everyone to view and read the professionally produced posters.

Congress participants were treated to a sumptuous opening banquet on Thursday evening that was held at the Nirvana Resort. On Friday the after dinner activity included an acrobatic show at the Shangdi Recreation Club. The social events were topped off on Saturday by a closing banquet at the BSU cafeteria's third floor banquet room.

Many IASI members who remained in Beijing for two additional days after the Congress enjoyed Sunday morning's tour of a section of the Great Wall, located at the Badaling (Badaling is in Yanqing County, more than 70 kilometers northwest from the center of Beijing City). After lunch, members toured the peaceful and serene grounds of the Summer Palace. On Monday, the Forbidden City was the focus of the morning's activities. The tour of this huge palace complex, covering 74 hectares, started the south gate across from Tiananmen Square to the north gate. After a splendid lunch at a well known restaurant, the tour group proceeded to the Temple of Heaven.

Other News Bytes

SPOLIT and BISp

Georg Anders reports that the BISp-databases, *SPOLIT, SPOFOR, SPOMEDIA* are integrated in the German interdisciplinary science internet portal VASCODA since April 2004. In the context of VASCODA (http://www.vascoda.de) BISp works on the connection of the search terms used in SPOLIT with the semantically heterogeneous search terms having similar meaning in different databases of social sciences, pedagogics, psychology and medicine (and some more in the future) so that it will be possible to have cross database searching with the SPOLIT terms. BISp, the German Sport University Cologne, Institute of Applied Training Science (IAT) in Leipzig, German Association of Sport Science and the Friedrich-Ebert-Foundation have made a cooperative application for financing the establishing of a "Virtual Library Sport Science" in Germany. One of the purposes of this planned Internet portal is the extension and the improvement of the nationwide access to the literature based on conventional and digital information sources with the aim of having a "one-stop-shopping" approach for sport researchers. The decision on this proposal will be made in the summer of 2005.

News from Australia

Information Centre Changes

The NSW Institute of Sport (NSWIS) Information Centre's collection based in Narrabeen has been transferred to the Australian College of Physical Education (ACPE), 8 Figtree Drive, Sydney Olympic Park. As a result there is now a 'super' sports library/information centre at Sydney Olympic Park. Anne Anderson is now located at the NSW Tourism, Sport and Recreation Central Office, Sydney Olympic Park, Homebush, and will have access to an electronic collection of journals and access to the ACPE Library.

NSIC - International

Over the last two months the NSIC has been involved in two international projects: Zacchaeus Emmanuel, Chief Librarian with the Nigerian National Institute for Sports (NNIS is located at the National Stadium Compex in Surulere, Lagos), undertook a two month training placement within the NSIC. In addition, the NSIC provided assistance in selecting and purchasing new resources for the NNIS Library. (Note: the NIS focuses on the training of sports administrators, coaches, sports broadcasters and sport medical specialists.) The NSIC developed a sports information services strategy for the Papua New Guinea National Sports Institute based in Goroka. The Australian Sports Commission (ASC) also provided funding to purchase new resources for the Institute's Library.

Jodie Davis, NSIC Web Services Manager, resigned from the ASC after 16 years service. Jodie was responsible for the developing the ASC's first website in 1995 and subsequent rebuilds and refinements.

Database Updates

SPONET

During mealtime at the BSU Guesthouse restaurant, Hartmut Sandner, Head, Information and Documentation Dept., at Leipzig's Institute for Applied Training Science, described the techniques he and his staff use to keep the SPONET database healthy and up to date. He mentioned that there are now 10,600 references in the database, most with abstracts. In addition, there's a new search platform for SPONET. Using Google, performing database searches and following up on known sport sciences researchers are all methods employed by staff to find additional references for the database. Other work entails seeking permission from publishers to include the abstract in the database, or writing one where necessary.

SportBox: a database of German language sport books http://www.sportbox.de/

In another initiative, Hartmut has created a database of German language sport sciences books, ranging from instruction manuals to advanced level research materials. His new database is called SportBox. There are now 1,015 books in the database from over 100 publishing houses. A request is made for a sample copy of the book and permission

sought to write an abstract and scan the cover of the book for placement in the database. To view the books click on Literatur-service. To search for titles click on Suche.
